I would like to thank the many people who so far have donated to our bake less bake sale. We are continuing this fundraiser for two more months. Names of those who donated are listed on page 5.


In the last newsletter I mentioned giving out COVID Care Packages. See page 6 for information on when to pick up your package.

## **Nutrition: Meatless Monday**

Meatless Monday is not a new idea, it was developed during World War I to reduce consumption of key staples to aid the war efforts. In 2003 it was reintroduced as a public health awareness campaign to help decrease our consumption of meat to help become eco-friendly and help our planet. It's also a way to improve your health as well too! The idea of skipping meat for the day and replacing your protein with either dairy, eggs, or plant-based proteins can be helpful when you are trying to watch your weight as well as most of these protein sources are less calories and contain less fat than their meat counterparts. Here are some meatless meal ideas.

Black Bean Quesadillas or Burritos- Sauté onions, garlic, bell peppers and black beans along with a little salt, pepper, and cumin, and place into a whole grain wrap with a little cheese.

Chick pea pasta (ex: Banza) with marinara sauce

Quinoa made with chicken peas and sautéed zucchini, bell peppers, and mushrooms

Tofu stir fry - sauté any vegetables you like along with firm tofu that has been cubed up and add a little low sodium teriyaki sauce. Place over brown rice, quinoa, or riced cauliflower.

Veggie omelet

Black bean burgers on whole grain buns

Vegetable lasagna

Zucchini or Broccoli quiche

Lentil soup


#### **Outdoor Flea Market**
